Volunteers Making a Difference

This past year the volunteer team consisted of 243 volunteers serving 28,488 hours in fiscal year 2020. They provided a donation of \$60,000 which includes \$46,000 for Hillside Hospice Facility, \$5,000 to Lifeline, \$4,000 to Annual Scholarship Fund, \$4,000 to Employees Helping Employees and \$1,000 to the Hillside Manor Beauty Shop. Volunteer areas of MMC-BD service include Gift Shop, Information Desks, Hillside Manor, Remembrance Home, Eagles Wings, Home Care, Hospice, Kids Care, Accounting, Foot Clinic, Home Knitting, Human Resources, Education, Mail Delivery, Marketing, HealthWorks, Piano Playing, Health Information Management and Rehab.
